Summit and Medina Counties Celebrate In-Demand Jobs Week May 2-6

The fifth annual In-Demand Jobs Week of Summit and Medina Counties will be held May 2-6, 2022. Part of a statewide celebration of jobs, industries, and skills that are in-demand in Ohio, the event highlights Ohio's top jobs that pay more than \$50,000 per year and require a credential rather than a degree or years of training.

At the local level, the Summit and Medina OhioMeansJobs centers will celebrate by hosting daily events for job seekers which concentrate on available training and apprenticeships opportunities, as well as recruitment events with large employers in healthcare, information technology, and manufacturing. To provide flexibility for job seeker participation, events will be held virtually, onsite at the OhioMeansJobs centers, and several local libraries.
