Jones, President, Stark State College, nominated Ms. Amanda Hinkel, Director of Career Services and Workforce Development, Stark State College, for appointment to the WDB as a Summit County appointee and representative of an institution of higher education located in Area 2, and;

WHEREAS, upon the review of the WDB Executive Committee and Executive Shapiro, it has been determined that Ms. Amanda Hinkel is an appropriate representative of an institution of higher education located in Area 2, and that those parties have therefore recommended Ms. Hinkel for appointment to the WDB;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the SAMWA COG that:

SECTION 1
